## Welcome to Pisa!

### The venue(s) and some history

#### 18/06/2025 AIEAA Pre-Conference | Stazione Leopolda

The first meeting point of the 14<sup>th</sup> AIEAA Conference is the **Stazione Leopolda**. Located between Via Francesco da Buti and Via Carlo Cattaneo, very close to Piazza Guerrazzi and not far from the Central train station, this historical site was the first railway station built in Tuscany, the second in Italy. Inaugurated in 1844 by Grand Duke Pietro Leopoldo II, the station initially connected the city of Pisa with the city of Livorno and was located at the entrance of the city from Florence.

In 1871 the Leopolda was replaced by the current Central Station and it started being used as a freight yard until 1929. Later, it became home to the fruit and vegetable local market.

In 1996 the entire structure underwent major renovations, which transformed it into the current modern multifunctional centre: a huge space with two naves separated by an archway that will host our pre-conference and social dinner.

The second venue of the AIEAA Conference is the **Department of Agriculture, Food and Environment of the University of Pisa (DAFE)**, and the contiguous modern **Polo Piagge**.

Since 1840 there has been in Pisa a Chair of Agriculture and Pastoralism, as established by the Grand Duke Leopoldo II of Lorraine, hold by the Marquis Cosimo Ridolfi, farmer, student of agricultural studies and member (and then president) of the *Accademia dei Georgofili*, driven by the innovative idea of “professing agriculture at the University.”

Indeed, in 1844, the School of Agriculture was established and later, the Faculty of Agriculture in 1871: it was the first university institution of agricultural studies in the world.

The pink historical building, today the headquarter of the PAGE group, was back then, the location of the Agricultural School led by the Marquis. If you meet *Cosimino*, the cat, in the garden, please, give him some cuddles: he might represent the living spirit of Ridolfi, protecting all the students and scholars from the Department. The DAFE as we know it today was established in 2012.

### How to get to Pisa



Pisa International Airport “Galileo Galilei”, or Florence “Peretola” International Airport, are the closest ones.

From **Florence Airport**, you can get the *Tramvia* to Santa Maria Novella railway station and take a train to Pisa Centrale (more info in the next page).

From **Pisa Airport**: [Pisamover](#), the train shuttle, takes only 5 minutes to Pisa Centrale (with 1 intermediate stop). One-way ticket costs 6,5 €, round trip 13,00 €. In June, it runs from 6:00 am to 1:00 am. Automatic machines are also available at your departure station.

**AT Bus n. 5** (Antoni bus stop, 500 m from the Airport) to Pisa Centrale

There are always a few **taxis** in front of Pisa Airport, at the Arrivals.

**Radio Taxi Pisa (Co.Ta.Pi)** is the main taxi cooperative in Pisa.

15-20 € is the range price from the airport to the city centre.

### How to get to Pisa



Take the so-called SS1 Aurelia if you are coming from Florence, Rome, and Genoa.

**From Florence:** before entering SS1 Aurelia, please follow either the A11 Florence-Mare Motorway or the Florence-Pisa-Livorno expressway.

**From Genoa:** before entering the SS1 Aurelia, you should travel on the A12 Genoa-Rosignano Motorway.

**From Rome:** the best choice is to combine the A1 Motorway to Florence, and then follow the Same A11 Motorway and SS1 Aurelia



[LINK](#) to the **Trenitalia website** to plan your trip to Pisa and buy your virtual tickets. Physical tickets can be purchased at the ticket office at the station, at the automatic ticket machines or at the counters.

**From Florence,** trains depart almost every 30 minutes (more often during peak hours), and a single ticket costs 9,30 €.

The journey by train lasts between 50 mins and 1h20.

### How to get to Pisa



[LINK](#) to download the **AT (Autolinee Toscane) App**, which you can use for urban transportation in Florence and Pisa (same price, 1,7 € the one-way option lasts 90 min in Florence and 70 mins in Pisa). Automatic machines are available at the *Tramvia* stop in Florence, and in Pisa/Florence you can buy tickets at the kiosk or at the tobacco shops. You can also pay with Tap mode onboard, with your credit card, on the trams and busses.

**To the DAFE:** take the **AT Bus n. 13** (to Borghetto 2 bus stop, Direction: Ospedale Cisanello) or **14** (to Agnelli bus stop, Direction: Ospedale Cisanello)

**To Polo Piagge:** take the **AT Bus n. 1+** (to Matteotti 3 bus stop, Direction: Ospedale Cisanello)

To the **Stazione Leopolda**, you can take the **AT busses n. 14, 5, or 1+.**



**By walking from Pisa Airport** it takes around 20 mins **to Leopolda Station** (1,4 km) and 30 mins **to Polo Piagge** (2 km).

**By walking from Pisa Centrale**, it takes around 10 mins **to Leopolda Station** (700 m), 18 mins **to Polo Piagge** (1,2 km) and 20 mins **to DAFE** (1,4 km).

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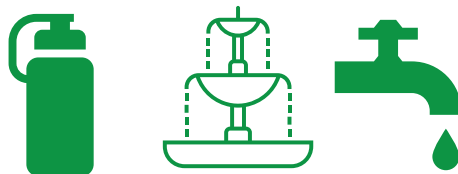
## General Info

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## Live the best Pisa enogastronomy experience!

One of the best *Street Foods* in Pisa is the **CECINA** (or «torta di ceci»)!

A delicious flatbread composed of chickpea flour, water, olive oil and salt: this can be served with some black pepper and eaten with bread. Traditionally, it can be accompanied with eggplants!

In most of these places, you can also have the typical **Pisa-type of pizza**, cooked in the oven within a pan, usually divided in 8 slices: it is particularly crunchy but soft inside. The «pizza alla pisana» is topped with capers, anchovies, and some grana.
